Presentation

Mrs. Dykslag and Mr. Buchanan shared with the parents the 2018/2019 proposed budget that has some significant cuts to supports to diverse needs students. Inclusion Coach Time and Social Worker time has been reduced and that will have a negative impact on supports in the school. Reductions have been made due to a funding profile provided to Wolf Creek that has not been updated by Alberta Education since 2007, depleted reserve dollars in Wolf Creek, reduction in enrollment numbers and no increases on the student grant for the coming school year. Parents are encouraged to talk to the school and consider writing letters to lobby the government to fund special education.

Ryan Lee Rice Memorial Citizenship Awards Ceremony

The Ryan Lee Rice Quality Citizenship Awards ceremony is scheduled for Tuesday, June 26th at 2:00 p.m. The Ryan Lee Rice Memorial Citizen Award was established in 1985 by Harvey and Margaret Rice in memory of their son, Ryan, who passed away in September 1985. Ryan was a Grade 6 student who held the distinction of being the first recipient of the Nelson School's (now École Lacombe Upper Elementary School) **Super Kid Award**. This award later became known as the **Perfect Panda Award**.

Each year, a **Ryan Lee Rice Memorial Citizenship Award** is presented to one individual in each classroom who has consistently demonstrated the following characteristics:

- ❖ Exhibits positive interpersonal relationships with peers and adults
- ❖ Demonstrates a consistent high level of responsibility, dependability and cooperation
- ❖ Demonstrates a high level of consideration for the personal feelings and property of others
- ❖ Is a positive role model in terms of leadership and participation in both school and classroom activities

Each recipient's name is engraved on a centrally located plaque. Recipients also receive a personalized certificate and an engraved trophy both of which are sponsored by the **École Lacombe Upper Elementary School Council**.

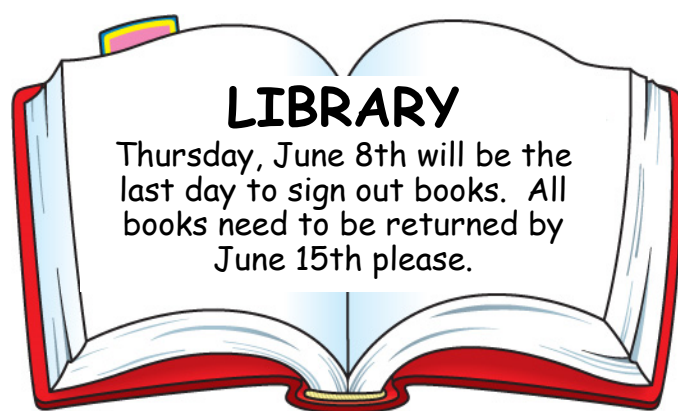

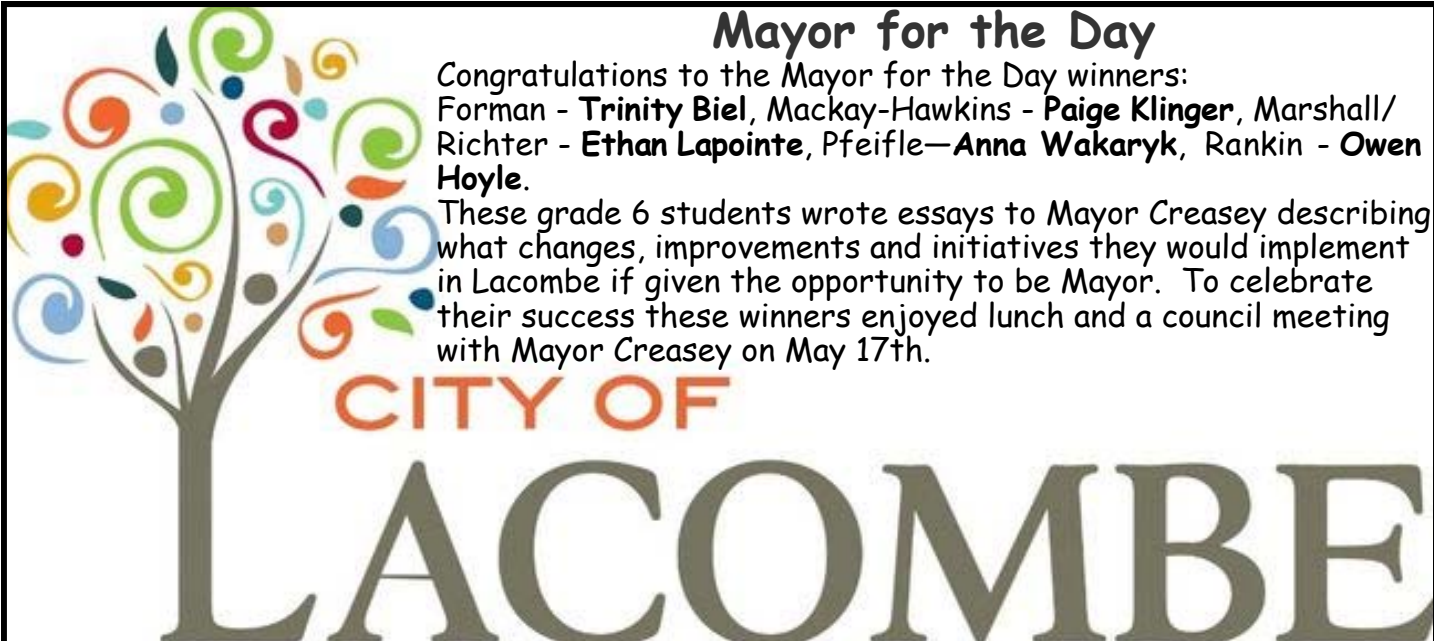

Exciting Changes to Wolf Creek Academy for the 2018-2019 School Year!



We want to inform you of some exciting changes occurring with WCPS's Wolf Creek Academy (WCA) program.

In September of the 2018/2019 school year Wolf Creek Academy will be utilizing the vacant north end of the École Lacombe Upper Elementary School (ÉLUES) building. This area is being renovated to house the Wolf Creek Academy program.

Wolf Creek Academy is committed to alignment with WCPS vision and priorities and works as a collaborative resource with schools in WCPS. "Students experiencing significant disruption in their education due to behavioral challenges (stemming from academic, behavior, mental health, trauma/other) are referred to WCA and are afforded the opportunity to build the pivotal skills in the areas of social/emotional/behavioral and academics to be successful to transition to the traditional setting, exposure to real life situations, and/or work."

WCA will be sharing the physical building with ÉLUES, but will have their own learning space, staffing, administration, students, and resources. ÉLUES and WCA look forward to this opportunity and anticipates that there will be increased opportunities for students, sharing of resources and professional development.

The current process for students transitioning to and from WCA will not change... Students who require intensive supports may be referred by a school's Intervention Team, and through a referral process, it may be determined that a student will benefit from participating in WCA programming. Joe Bouvier, Assistant Principal, also provides positive behavior supports to students and school staff throughout WCPS to assist with the success of students in their home school. There are a limited number of spaces available at WCA, providing students with a structured, small group setting.

Ms. Lana Nogue, Director of Inclusive Learning Services, will continue to supervise the overall operations of WCA. The day-to-day operations will be overseen by Mr. Joe Bouvier, Acting Assistant Principal. Barb Reaney, Director of Safe & Caring Schools, will remain as a support to WCA and Sonja Dykslag, Principal of ÉLUES will be available for support to the program as needed.

We are looking forward to working with both ÉLUES and WCA staff over the next few months to prepare for a smooth transition. We would also like to acknowledge and thank the ÉLUES staff and Administration for welcoming WCA staff and students into their school.

Any WCA parent/guardian whose child is moving to a new location will be contacted to discuss their child's programming needs and any other related information for transition and start-up of the new year.

We thank you for your patience and understanding as we move to a new location. We have excellent support from our families and are committed to work and communicate with you as we make this change. Talking about Human Sexuality

During the month of June our classes will cover the curricular outcomes listed in the program of studies for the topic of Human Sexuality. Parents are encouraged to use the classroom discussions as a springboard to further discussions at home. The curricular objectives for each of the grade levels are listed below:

Grade Four

The students will.... describe the physical, emotional, and social changes that occur during puberty ie. menstruation, secondary sexual characteristics, changing identity and moods.

Grade Five

Students will...identify the basic components of the human reproductive system and describe the basic functions of the various components e.g. fertilization, conception.

Grade Six

Students will... examine and evaluate the risk factors associated with exposure to blood borne diseases - HIV, AIDS, hepatitis B/C; e.g. sharing needles, body piercing, tattooing, helping someone who is bleeding, being sexually active.

Students will... identify and describe the stages and factors that can affect human development from conception through birth.

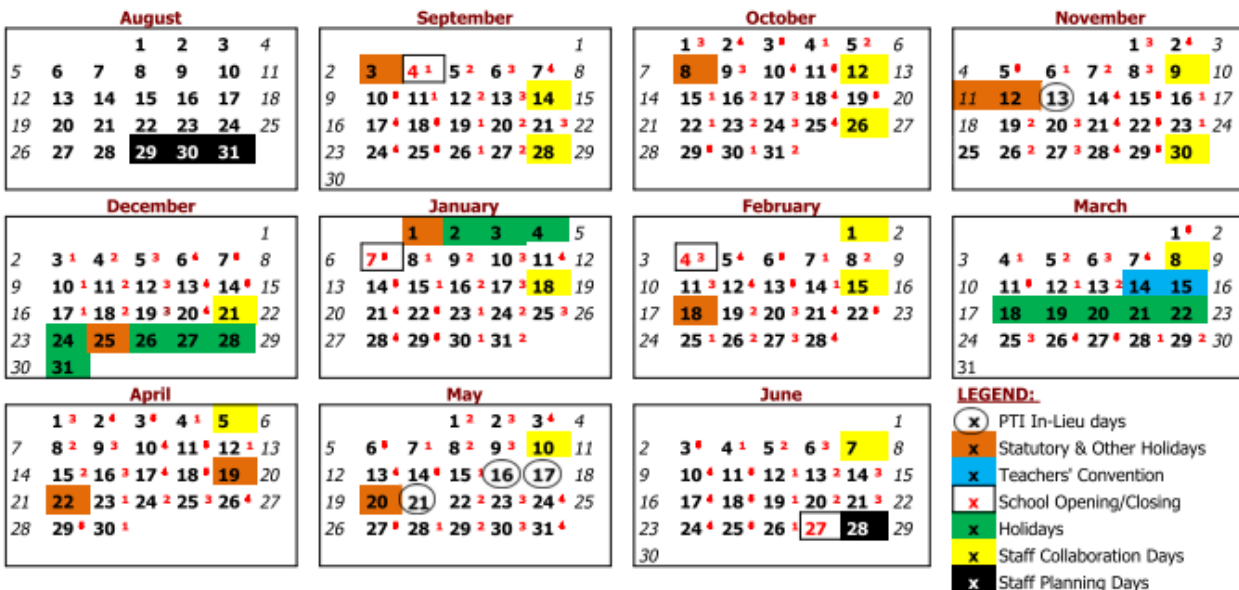

You will have received an email from ÉLUE (or ÉLJHS if your student is enrolling in Grade 6) asking you to validate your student information & demographics in order to complete the re-registration process. Here are some FAQ's you might also have!

I have not received an email from the school yet—what do I do?

Please call Mrs. Broderson in the office to verify the current email address on file; another email can be sent if the address is incorrect/outdated.

What is a snapcode?

Our new online system assigns snapcodes to each student to link them to our database. When you are re-registering a currently enrolled student, you must follow the link in the email that is sent to you as the snapcode is directly embedded in that specific link. Make sure you are registering through the email sent to you from the school to ensure the information is linked.

Why do I have to provide my child's birth certificate?

Alberta Education requires a copy of every student's birth certificate or legal citizenship documents to be on file. If you have already submitted this information, you do not need to submit it again, you can just type in "on file". If you are encountering difficulty uploading your document(s), you can email the information to the school or bring the documents in to be scanned at the office.

I keep getting "kicked out" or sent back—help?!

There are parameters on the registration form that ensure all required information has been entered correctly; please check for errors highlighted in red and address as necessary. The system is most compatible with computers/laptops; it may lag when using a phone or tablet. We recommend the use of a computer - you are welcome to stop in at the school and use one of our computers if required.

I have registered—now what?

You can login to your parent portal August 29th to find out your child's teacher for the 2018-2019 school year.

Can I come in and fill out a paper form?

Wolf Creek School Division has adopted a 100% online process for all students in the division. All students will need to register/re-register online. If you need assistance during the registration process, please contact the school office.

What if we are moving?

If you are moving to another school *within Wolf Creek*, you simply register through your email link and in the dropdown menu, select the school which you will be attending. **We do ask that you please inform the office if you are moving out of WCPSD so we can plan accordingly**

When do I find out my child's classroom teacher?

The school will no longer post the class lists on the front doors for confidentiality reasons. Instead, parents are invited to log into their Parent Portal to find out whose class your child will be in. This information will be available as of August 29th. Those who do not have access ID & passwords for Parent Portal (ie., those new to the school), can contact the front office as of August 27th. Alternatively, parents/guardians can find out their child's teacher from school personnel either during the school's open house on August 31st (8:30am-10:00am), or on the first day of school, September 4th.
