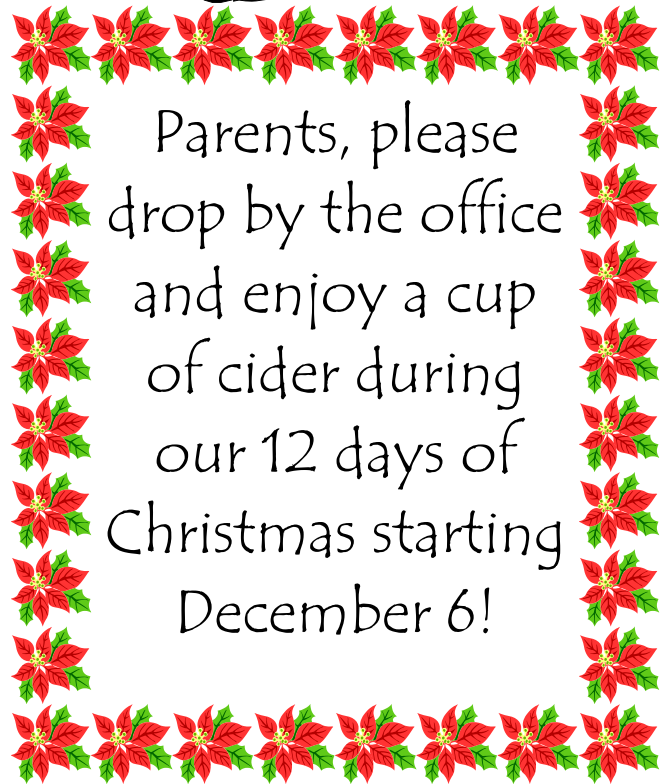

School Council Happenings

École Lacombe Upper Elementary School - School Council Meeting Minutes - September 27, 2023

A big **THANK YOU** to everyone who attended our School Council Meeting on November 29th, 2023. Following is a summary of the meeting highlights.

Correspondence and Reports:

1. **Hunger Busters (Angela Richter):** For the rest of the year, hot lunches are scheduled for once a week, if possible. We have been asked by a parent if we could increase the frequency of lunches. Currently, we are not prepared to offer more. When we started offering Hot Lunches, they were scheduled for once a month. In the last few years we have increased them to once a week. Hot Lunches are a disruption for our teachers (calling parents if a child thought they ordered and didn't, dealing with upset students if their parent has not ordered) so adding more to their plate is not ideal. All of the paperwork (creating labels, creating the class lists, tracking payments, submitting the bill) is all extra work for our Admin Assistant, Natalie Broderson. She is not given more time for this, she works it into her already busy schedule. We feel the amount of lunches we offer is enough for our school.
2. **Trustee Report (Kelly Lowry):** Not in attendance.
3. **Treasurer's Report (Christina Rice):** The funds collected have supported the Cross Country Running Team pinnies, ÉLUES Swag for monthly assemblies and parent council is supporting the purchase of C-Pens.
4. **Staff Report (Michele Brousseau):** Requesting for support for 2 C-Pen Reader. Motion made by (J. Graham) for the School Council to cover the cost for 2 C-Pens (\$360 x 2). Second by (C. Rice). All in favor. The C-Pens will support many students with reading difficulties.

Principal's Report: Craig Fullarton

It is hard to believe that we are approaching the Christmas season already and the year has flown by up until this point! Events like Healthy Living Fair, monthly assemblies, and Halloween Carnival are just a number of the many events that have happened recently that create long-lasting memories for our students, families, and staff

We are so grateful for the impact that our student teachers have had while at our school. Post-secondary students from the University of Alberta, University of Calgary, Burman University, and Red Deer Polytechnic have spent time completing a variety of different practicums and have made a huge impact in our building. We thank them for all of their contributions to our school and the year we have had so far and wish them all the very best as they head into the final stretch of their studies.

One of the school's long time Educational Assistants, Vicky Cornish, has announced her retirement at the end of this calendar year. We wish Vicky all of the very best in her retirement and cannot thank her enough for her many, many years of service and the number of students she has positively impacted. She will be sorely missed. The school will be posting an ad for an Educational Assistant to begin in the new year.

New Business

1. **Joint Council Idea-** The focus will be on Artificial Intelligence led by Greg Esteves in March. This will more than likely be held at Lacombe Composite High School.
2. **School Council Grant- \$500-** Ideas on how to use this were discussed. One parent suggested reaching out to a speaker about anxiety and disconnect from the real world. This speaker recently presented at ÉJSM but is in Europe until February at least. School will attempt to connect with her.
3. **Funding Ed Tech (Chromebooks, C-Pens, etc.)-** Ideas? Grants? Staff discussed the need for technology to be renewed and replaced in the upcoming years. The school has no more extra Chromebooks to lend out to students who do not have one. Different grants were discussed. It was suggested that the school reach out to a group in Red Deer (CityServe) who donates returned Chromebooks from Amazon. Craig let the group know that the school will be participating in the Cilantro and Chive Ice Cream Sandwich fundraiser with money going towards supporting the purchase of new Chromebooks and educational technology.
4. **Spring Event Feedback-** Ideas were brainstormed for a spring event to bring families and community groups into the school while also serving as a fundraiser for grade 6 camp.
5. **ÉLUES ACE Plan-** Can be found on the website (attendees were shown how and where to access the document). Craig did an overview of the document as well as the purpose and intent of an ACE Plan. Several areas of celebration were shared as well as the school and division focus on differentiated learning and student/parent engagement.
6. **Budget Update/Considerations-** Highlights from November's administrator meeting were shared including the need for the division to purchase new school buses to meet government regulations on student transportation. More details about technology replacement and maintenance over the next several years were shared.

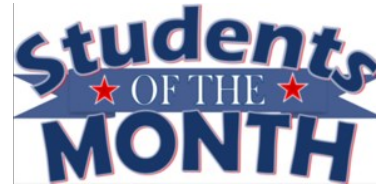

Healthy Living Fair a HUGE success!

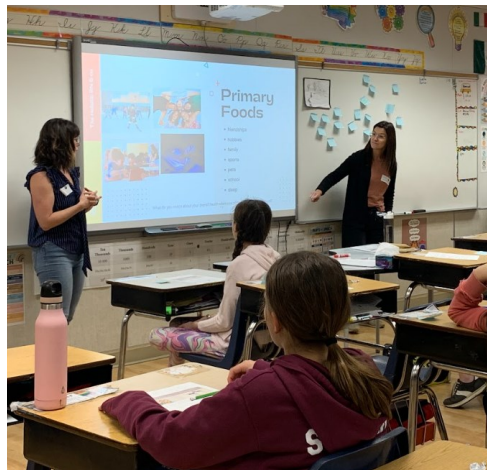
We had another spectacular Healthy Living Fair on Thursday, November 23!

Smile You're On Camera

Why is there video surveillance in schools?



AP 181

In Wolf Creek Public Schools **video cameras provide personal safety and security of students** and personal property. The use of cameras and video surveillance is commonplace in schools across Alberta and indeed Canada. **Administrative Procedure 181 (AP 181)** is used in Wolf Creek Public Schools to govern the use of video surveillance.

- The use of video surveillance **is intended to be minimally intrusive, and is used exclusively in common areas in the schools.**
- Cameras **ARE NOT** in classrooms nor are they in any areas, such as washrooms, gym locker rooms, etc. where there would be an expectation of privacy.
- In Wolf Creek, the use of video surveillance complies with provincial and federal laws, and **is there to add to, rather than to replace, direct supervision by school staff.**



Viewing the videos

Anyone who is the subject of the video has the **right to request access** to the video recording.

Parents can request to review a segment of video related to a specific incident involving their child or children. That may be granted only after considering and ensuring the privacy of any other individuals in the video. Access can be denied for privacy reasons.

Monitors will not be located in an area where the video surveillance can be publicly viewed.

Principal, designated employees or agents of the school division only have access to the camera and video recordings. **Videos are kept in a secure storage, are never sold or publicly viewed or distributed.**

Keeping the video recordings

Videos will be erased or disposed of within 21 days unless they are being kept at the request of the principal, division, employee, parent or student for documentation related to a specific incident, for law enforcement, or for insurance.

Any video kept will be destroyed once the incident in question is resolved.

Reviewing Administrative Procedure 181

AP 181 is subject to review by the superintendent.
